## Cedar Centers Shopping Area Clean-up

Councilman Engel's office has received several calls about the trash around the Cedar Center shopping area ditch. Leslie Curneal, Legal Assistance, Metro Councilman Robin Engel, reached out to Pete Flood, Louisville Metro Department of Public Works, Compliance & Enforcement Manager, for assistance. Pete discovered most of the litter comes from the parking lots of the various stores and many people throwing trash into the ditch. Although this is a common problem, what sets this one apart from others is the fact it's a large ditch and no one wants to enter because it's unsafe.

Pete made the following recommendations on ways to reduce the trash needing removal:

1. Meeting with businesses or the ones generating most of the litter on ways to prevent/reduce litter
2. Adding litter baskets in the parking lots
3. Investigating some type of barrier to keep litter from blowing or being thrown into the ditch
4. Hiring a company to keep the lot and ditch clean on a periodic basis

While cleaning the ditch on his own one Sunday, Pete encountered a group of people picking up litter on Bardstown Road. He stopped to thank them and learned they are cleaning 2 miles of Bardstown Road four times a year (adopt a highway) in honor of a family member (Michael Tungate). A Big Thank You goes out to this group.

## Member Announcements



On Thursday, May 10, 2018 at 4:00 pm, Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz will join Father John A. Schwartzlose, pastor of Saint Gabriel Parish in blessing the first natural playground at any of the 110 archdiocesan parishes or 49 schools of the Archdiocese and one of the first of its kind in Jefferson County. This event will take place on the Saint Gabriel the Archangel campus at 5505 Bardstown Road, Louisville, Ky. 40291. Activities include music, food trucks, a petting zoo, face painting and a Gaga ball tournament. The parish worked with Booker Design Collaborative and E-Z Construction, a team of educators from the school and parish staff to design an all-age, environmentally-friendly, and aesthetically beautiful Playpark where kids can create, innovate and engage in over 18 unique natural experiences. The Playpark will be open to the parish and the broader Fern Creek community.



Since 1988, Fern Creek/Highview United Ministries (FCHUM) has faithfully and effectively served in uniting the community (church, civic, and corporate) in serving the community. Founded by 11 supporting congregations as a 501(c)3 charitable, not-for-profit organization, FCHUM is now supported in part by 22 congregations representing 11 denominations, as well as numerous civic and corporate community partners. Through the decades, FCHUM has united the community (church, civic, and corporate) in fighting hunger, preventing homelessness, caring for the elderly, and

stabilizing lives. Through programs such as:

- The Individual & Family Assistance Center (IFAC), operating Monday – Friday from 10:00 -1:30, now serves well over 1,000 people monthly, distributing over 25,000 pounds of food, and over \$20,000 in financial assistance, while leveraging \$50,000-\$60,000 in utilities assistance through participation in the Association of Community Ministries.
  - Our Health Equipment Loan Program (HELP) Equipment, such as wheelchairs, portable toilets, shower stools, and walkers has been donated.
  - The Adult Day Health Center (ADC) provides over 23,000 hours of activities and personal care
- FCHUM's programs are often singled out for special recognition. In 2013, IFAC was recognized as the Dare To Care Jefferson County Food Pantry of the Year. In 2018, IFAC was recognized as a Center of Excellence. The ADC has become a model not only locally, but regionally, and at the national level. Its staff has been awarded numerous accolades through its 25 years. The Executive Director received the ElderServe Champion for Aging Award in 2015. FCHUM keeps its management and general administrative expenses very low, generally below 25%, most often between 10-15 % of overall budget.

### ***“Fighting Hunger – Preventing Homelessness – Caring for the Elderly – Stabilizing Lives”***

#### **What does FCHUM hope to accomplish this year?**

Each year, **Fern Creek/Highview United Ministries (FCHUM)** unifies the community (church, civic, & corporate) in serving the community. Through our various programs, providing vital social services, we seek to fight hunger, prevent homelessness, aid the elderly, and stabilize lives for our neighbors in need.

In the upcoming year, through our **Individual & Family Assistance Center (IFAC)**, we estimate that we will assist 4,000 to 5,000 families, totaling over 16,000 people, by providing food, securing utilities, obtaining medications, assisting with clothing needs, securing rent/mortgages, assisting with transportation needs, providing back to school supplies, distributing Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets, and facilitating Christmas gifts. Our **Health Equipment Loan Program (HELP)** generally provides assistance to between 25 – 50 people annually. We estimate that, in partnership with the Louisville Metro Nutrition Office, we will deliver over 3,000 nutritious lunches accompanied by a friendly, compassionate daily visit to homebound older adults. That is all a part of the **Meals On Wheels (MOW)** program. Through the efforts of our **Adult Day Health Center (ADC)** we project that our staff will provide 23,000 to 24,000 hours of activities and personal care, over 2,000 hours of nursing services, 1,400-1,500 breakfasts, and 2,500-2,800 lunches to frail older adult enabling them to stay in their own homes or with family, relieve caregiver stress, and help many caregivers remain in the work force.

Additionally, **FCHUM will continue to play a leading role in various community events** and efforts such as the Highview Community Fall Festival, the Highview Holiday Fest, various church picnics and events like the James O. Leach Hunger Awareness Dinner, Dare to Care's Community Hunger Walk, the EAGLES Chicken dinners, Summer Friday Fests, and the actions of such groups as the Fern Creek Community Association and Chamber of Commerce, the Highview Business Association, TRIAD, HSPN, the Fern Creek/Highview Ministerial Association's Choir Festival and Community Thanksgiving Service, and the Association of Community Ministries.

Finally, as FCHUM celebrates its **30<sup>th</sup> anniversary year in 2018**, we hope to complete our **Investing to Serve: Legacy of Caring Sustainability Campaign**. With the development of this \$250,000 sustainability fund, FCHUM, being good stewards of fiscal resources, will be able to secure and sustain the operations of our facility into perpetuity. Monthly dividends will cover the costs of operating the facility. Currently around \$213,000 has been raised.
